

Residential Appliance Rebate Form

Eligibility Requirements

- Only ENERGY STAR® qualified appliances, as determined by the United States Department of Energy, are eligible for the WMMLP Appliance Rebate Incentive Program. See listing on www.energystar.gov website for more information.
 - Customers must have an active residential account with WMMLP and that account must be in good standing.
 - Proof of purchase after January 1, 2010 must be provided to WMMLP in the form of a copy of the sales receipt.
 - **A copy of the EnergyGuide label from the appliance which shows the Energy Star® logo or a printout from www.energystar.gov website showing your appliance is Energy Star® rated MUST be returned with the application.**
 - Rebate form must be received within twelve (12) months of purchase.
 - A completed copy of this form must be remitted to WMMLP to be eligible for a rebate.
 - The qualifying appliance must be installed at the active account location.
 - A limit of two (2) appliances per customer account are eligible for WMMLP's Appliance Rebate Program each calendar year.
 - The rebate will be in the form of a check from the Town of Wellesley or a credit to your electric account, at the sole discretion of WMMLP.
 - WMMLP reserves the right to verify installation of the appliance for which a rebate is requested.
 - WMMLP reserves the right to terminate this program at any time during the program year.
- Once we've received the Appliance Rebate Form and verified eligibility, a check or credit on your residential account bill for the appropriate amount will be issued.

The WMMLP is pleased to offer residents of Wellesley who purchase energy efficient EnergyStar® appliances rebates to help offset the cost of qualified appliances.

Did you know that the average home spends about \$1,300 on electric costs every year? Change to appliances that have earned ENERGY STAR approval, and you can save on energy costs, while saving the environment. Eligible EnergyStar® appliances and rebate amounts for this year's program include:

- ✂ Refrigerators – \$100
- ✂ Clothes washing machines – \$75
- ✂ Central air conditioners – \$100
with a Seasonal Energy Efficient Rating (SEER) of 14 or greater
- ✂ Room air conditioners – \$50
- ✂ Dishwashers – \$75
- ✂ Dehumidifiers – \$50

According to www.energy.star.gov:

Save Energy, Save Money

When buying an appliance, remember that it has two price tags: what you pay to take it home and what you pay for the energy and water it uses. ENERGY STAR qualified appliances incorporate advanced technologies that use 10-50% less energy and water than standard models. The money you save on your utility bills can more than make up for the cost of a more expensive but more efficient ENERGY STAR model.

Help Protect the Environment

Simple actions can make a big difference. If just one in 10 homes used ENERGY STAR qualified appliances, the change would be like planting 1.7 million new acres of trees.

For top performance, premium features, and energy savings, look for energy-efficient clothes washers, refrigerators, dishwashers, room air conditioners and dehumidifiers that have earned the ENERGYSTAR®. This mark may appear on the appliance, the packaging or the Energy Guide label.

Some other ways to reduce your energy consumption are by:

- Position your refrigerator away from a heat source such as an oven, a dishwasher, or direct sunlight from a window.
- To allow air to circulate around the condenser coils, leave a space between the wall or cabinets and the refrigerator or freezer and keep the coils clean.

Home Energy Audit Program

WMMLP continues to offer Residential Conservation Services designed to help customers conserve energy, and potentially reduce energy costs. The Town of Wellesley experienced an all-time high electric demand on June 10, 2008 at 4:00 pm and as energy costs continue to increase, conservation help is available to all residential customers. - Make sure the door seals are airtight.
- Keep your refrigerator between 35 and 38 degrees Fahrenheit and your freezer at 0 degrees Fahrenheit.
- Minimize the amount of time the refrigerator door is open.
- Recycle older or second refrigerators.
- Wash full loads - Clothes washers are most efficient when operated with full loads.
- Wash clothes in cold water.
- Use the moisture sensor option on your dryer, which automatically shuts off the machine when the clothes are dry.
- If your clothes washer has spin options, choose a high spin speed or extended spin option to reduce the amount of remaining moisture, thus starting the drying process before you put your clothes in the dryer.
- Air dry clothes whenever possible.
- Run your dishwasher with a full load. Most of the energy used by a dishwasher goes to heat water. Since you can't decrease the amount of water used per cycle, fill your dishwasher to get the most from the energy used to run it.
- Avoid using the heat-dry, rinse-hold and pre-rinse features. Instead use your dishwasher's air-dry option.
- Install a programmable thermostat - when used properly they can save you about \$150 per year on your energy bills.
