*About our panelists:*

**Karl (Chip) Case**, a Senior Fellow at the Joint Center for Housing Studies, Harvard University, has done extensive research in the areas of real estate, housing, tax policy and public finance; he is author or co-author of five books including Economics and Tax Policy, Property Taxation: The Need for Reform, and Principles of Economics (now in its tenth edition). He has served on boards of the American Real Estate and Urban Economics Association, the Lincoln Institute of Land Policy, the Harvard Kennedy School of Government's Rappaport Institute for Greater Boston, and the Academic Advisory Board of the Federal Reserve Bank of Boston. Professor Case received his B.A. from Miami University, spent three years on active duty in the Army, and then received his Ph.D. from Harvard. He is a long-time resident of Wellesley.

**Jeffrey Miron**, a Senior Fellow at the Cato Institute, is the Director of Undergraduate Studies in the Department of Economics at Harvard. He has also taught at the Sloan School of Management, Massachusetts Institute of Technology; the University of Michigan; and Boston University. He is the author of, among other things, The Economics of Seasonal Cycles and a macroeconomics casebook. The recipient of an Olin Fellowship from the National Bureau of Economic Research, an Earhart Foundation Fellowship, and a Sloan Foundation Faculty Research Fellowship, he received his B.A. from Swarthmore College and his Ph.D. from MIT. He, too, lives in Wellesley.
