ZONING BOARD OF APPEALS

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ZBA 99-73

Petition of Middlesex Savings Bank  
180 Linden Street

Pursuant to due notice, the Special Permit Granting Authority held a Public Hearing on Thursday, October 21, 1999 at 8 p.m. in the Selectmen's Meeting Room (Conference Room B) at the Town Hall, 525 Washington Street, Wellesley, on the petition of the MIDDLESEX SAVINGS BANK requesting renewal of a Special Permit pursuant to the provisions of Section XIII and Section XXV of the Zoning Bylaw to allow its premises at 180 LINDEN STREET, in an Industrial District, to continue to be used for a 24-hour drive-through Automatic Teller Machine (ATM), a use not allowed by right in said district.

On October 4, 1999, the petitioner filed a request for a hearing before this Authority, and thereafter, due notice of the hearing was given by mailing and publication.

Presenting the case at the hearing was Jane Green, Wellesley Branch Manager of the Middlesex Savings Bank. Ms. Green said that the bank would like to renew its Special Permit for the ATM. There have been no problems to report during the almost 3 years the bank has been open. There have been no changes in the conditions.

No other person present had any comment on the petition.

Statement of Facts

The subject property is located at 180 Linden Street, in an Industrial District. The property is owned by F. Diehl & Sons, and leased by Middlesex Savings Bank. Prior to 1994, the premises were leased by Bank of Boston and contained a pre-existing drive-through teller window. In 1994, Shawmut Bank leased the premises and was granted a Special Permit to convert the teller drive-through window to an ATM drive-through facility. In 1996, Middlesex Savings Bank leased the premises and was granted a Special Permit to continue to allow the existence of the 24-hour drive-through ATM facility, a use not allowed by right in an Industrial District. The petitioner is requesting renewal of the Special Permit which was issued again in 1997.

A vehicle queue lane with a width of 9 feet, which can contain four cars before extending to a length perpendicular to the sidewalk, is located in front of the building. There is a parallel parking lane so that vehicles are able to bypass the ATM facility to gain access to the street or adjacent parking areas. Pedestrian access to the bank is separated from the queue lane by railings and bollards.

On October 19, 1999, the Planning Board reviewed the petition and had no objection to renewal on the same terms and conditions as are currently in effect.

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Decision

This Authority has made a careful study of the material submitted and the information presented at the hearing. Middlesex Savings Bank is requesting renewal of a Special Permit to allow its premises at 180 Linden Street to be used for a drive-through 24-hour ATM facility.

It is the opinion of this Authority that the ATM drive-through facility satisfies all Special Permit Standards pursuant to Section XXV-D of the Zoning Bylaw, and that said use will be in harmony with the intent and purpose of the Zoning Bylaw.

A Special Permit is granted, as voted unanimously by this Authority at the Public Hearing, for the aforesaid use, subject to the following conditions:

1. There shall be no advertising sign associated with the operation of the ATM at the subject location.
2. The panel that displays the "network plaques" above the ATM facility shall not be internally illuminated.
3. No more than four vehicles shall be queued for the use of the ATM facility at any time.
4. This Special Permit shall expire two years from the date of this decision.
