Petition of Jenney Manufacturing Co.

Pursuant to due notice the Board of Appeal held a public hearing in the hearing room on the second floor of the Town Hall at 8:25 p.m. on October 5, 1967, on the petition of Jenney Manufacturing Co., requesting a special permit under the provisions of Section XXIIA, Part C, Subpart 3. a. 7. and Part E of the Zoning By-law which will allow the applicant to replace a standing sign at 258 Washington Street.

On September 5, 1967, the petitioner requested a hearing before this Board and thereafter due notice was given by mailing and publication.

Howard Field, representative of Cities Service Oil Co., represented the petitioner at the hearing.

Statement of Facts

The petitioner seeks permission to erect a standing sign on the premises involved which will replace the existing "Jenney" gasoline brand sign. The proposed sign is designed to be 7' x 7', supported on a steel pole 12' high. It is to have blue letters with the word "Citgo", and a red symbol on a white plastic background. It is to be internally illuminated by fluorescent lamps.

It was stated at the hearing that the petitioner has changed its gasoline brand to "Citgo" as the "Jenney" brand is being replaced Nationwide, and it is the desire of the petitioner to have a means of identification. It is proposed to remove the existing pole and sign and replace it with a pole which will be located 1'3" back from the street line with the standard Citgo sign erected on it.

A plot plan was submitted which showed the location of the proposed sign.

Decision

The Board finds that the proposed sign will be in harmony with the general purpose and intent of Section XXIIA of the Zoning By-law and will not be injurious to the neighborhood nor to traffic and safety conditions, nor otherwise detrimental to the public safety and welfare

Accordingly, the Board hereby grants permission for the proposed sign to be erected as shown on the plan submitted and on file with this Board, with the pole to be no closer to the street line than one foot three inches, and that said sign shall not violate any condition imposed in the license issued by the Board of Selectmen.
