Wellesley Health Department COVID-19 Case Update.

Total confirmed cases in Massachusetts: 1002,063 New Cases Today: 471

Total cases in Norfolk County: 8,625

Total cases in Wellesley: 218 (3 new)

82 cases total in Wellesley long-term care facilities

Positive antibody tests: 4 new, 45 total

The Massachusetts Department of Public Health is now reporting both confirmed and probable cases (positive antibody tests) of COVID-1. Because of this, there has been a significant increase in the number of statewide cases and deaths. These numbers include cases dating back to March 1, 2020. [See today's COVID-19 report.](#)
