Total confirmed cases in Massachusetts: 138,083

View the COVID-19 daily dashboard.

Total confirmed positive cases in Wellesley: 299 (11 new cases in past 14 days)
State and local Health officials report that the majority of new cases are due to household transmission, especially in multi-generational households living together. Very few cases are now attributed to community spread.

Average Daily Incidence Rate/100,000 for Wellesley: 2.6 (past 14 days) Read the Weekly COVID-19 Public Health report.

The Wellesley <u>Coronavirus Information Hub</u> includes an enhanced dashboard with data on Wellesley COVID-19 cases. The Hub also includes the <u>COVID-19 community level data map</u> with stoplight colors indicating COVID-19 risk levels by community: red (high risk), yellow (moderate risk), green and white (low risk). Wellesley remains in the **green** (low risk) category.

COVID-19 Testing Now at CVS-Route 9 East.

CVS has expanded its testing locations. <u>Self-swab testing for COVID-19</u> is now available at the Wellesley CVS on Route 9 East (984 Worcester Street) for people meeting Centers for Disease Control COVID-19 criteria. Patients must <u>register in advance at CVS.com</u> to schedule a testing appointment. You must be tested in the state where you are a resident.

Wellesley Public Schools Information.

The Wellesley Coronavirus Information Hub includes a dashboard of metrics for Wellesley Public Schools used by the district and the Health Department to determine the closing and re-opening of inperson learning if Wellesley experiences a spike in COVID-19 cases. UPDATED: USDA Free Meals for Kids Program Extended through June 2021. Families receiving free meals for children from schools will now continue to get them through <u>June 30, 2021</u>. <u>Learn more about the Free Meals for Kids Program</u>. November 3, 2020 Election.

Ballots for the November 3 Presidential and State Election have been mailed! Residents who applied for an Absentee or Vote-by-Mail ballot should be receiving them. PLEASE complete and sign your ballot and return it by mail or deliver it in-person to the secure ballot drop box in front of Town Hall.



Early in-person voting begins October 17 at the Tolles Parsons Center (500 Washington Street). Residents may vote early in-person on Monday-Friday from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. and on weekends from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. Visit the Town Clerk webpages for complete Election 2020 information.

All residents have the right to vote, free from intimidation and harassment. The Attorney General's office has set up a website with information on voter rights, voting methods, and election protection. Go to Protect the Vote to learn more.

U.S. Census Forms Due Today.

If you have not completed your U.S. Census form, the deadline to do so is **TODAY, October 15**. Responses may be submitted online at My2020Census until 11:59 p.m. Hawaii time. The U.S. Census Bureau will also accept mailed paper census forms if they are postmarked by October 15. Today is also the end date for collecting census phone responses and census door knocking.

Drive-thru Community Flu Clinics.

The Health Department is offering one more drive-thru flu clinic for residents 18 years old and over on October 20 at the Wellesley Municipal Light Plant. Clinics are **appointment only** and residents must sign up in advance online at www.wellesleyma.gov/fluclinic Everyone is urged to be vaccinated to help lessen the impact of flu cases during the ongoing Coronavirus pandemic.
