Mr. Ulfelder is an attorney in private practice following a lengthy career as an Assistant District Attorney and Assistant Attorney General in Massachusetts. He retired as Chief of the Special Prosecutions Unit in Suffolk County where he was responsible for prosecutions involving white-collar crime, public corruption, and police misconduct.

Prior to his career as an attorney, Mr. Ulfelder was employed as a hospital administrator in Connecticut and as a healthcare consultant, working in healthcare cost containment, and as a senior consultant for Arthur D. Little in Cambridge, MA. He has an undergraduate degree from Harvard, a Master's Degree in Public Health from Yale, and a law degree from the University of Connecticut School of Law.
