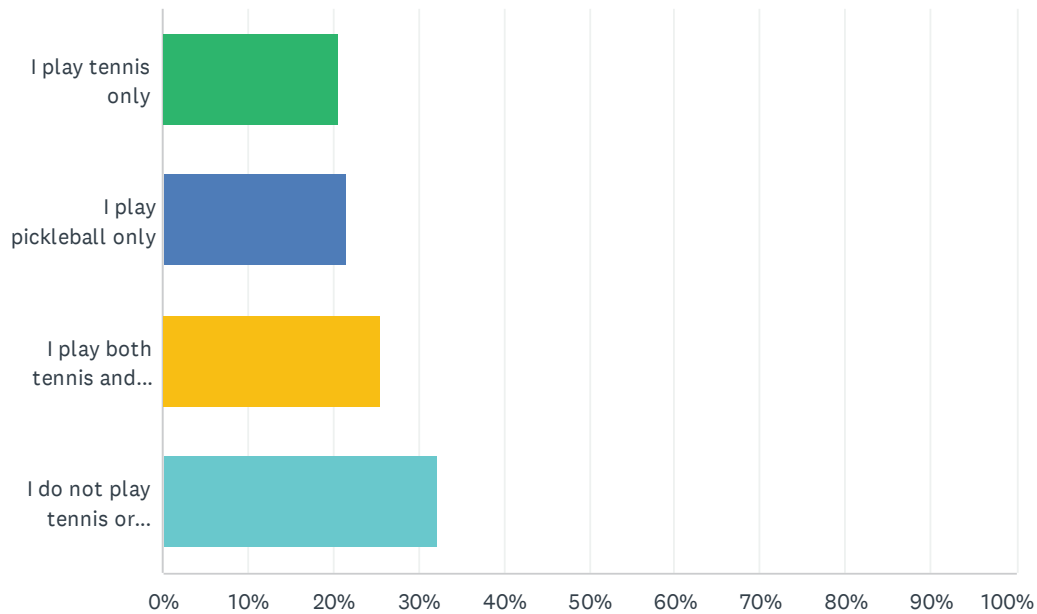

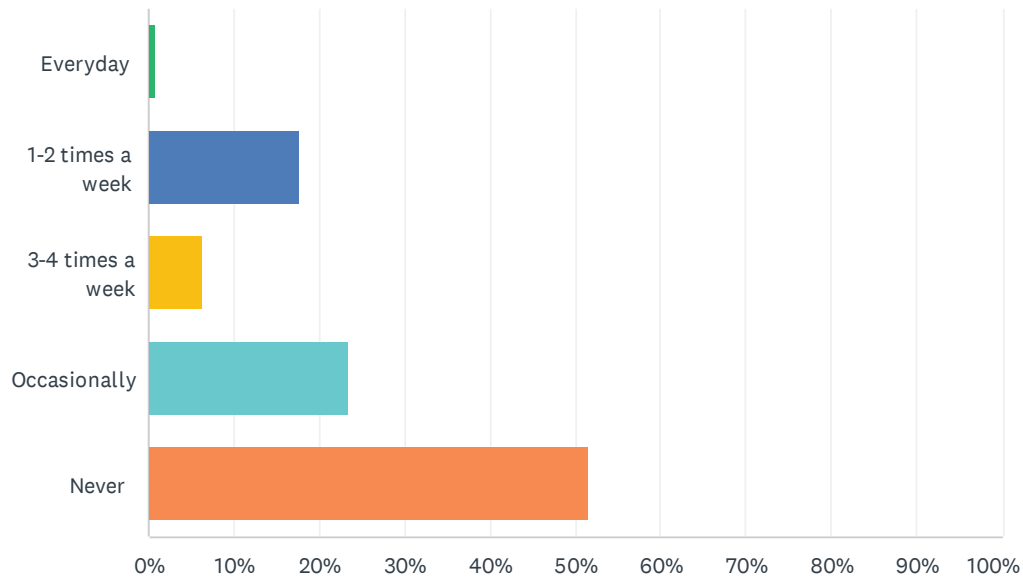

Q3 How often do you play pickleball a week?

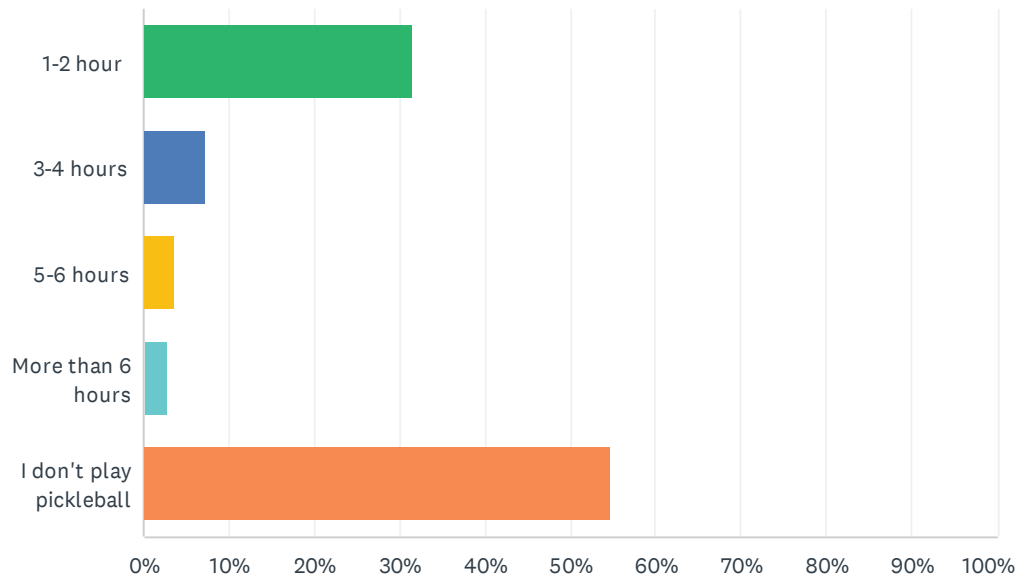

Q4 On average, how many hours do you play pickleball a week?

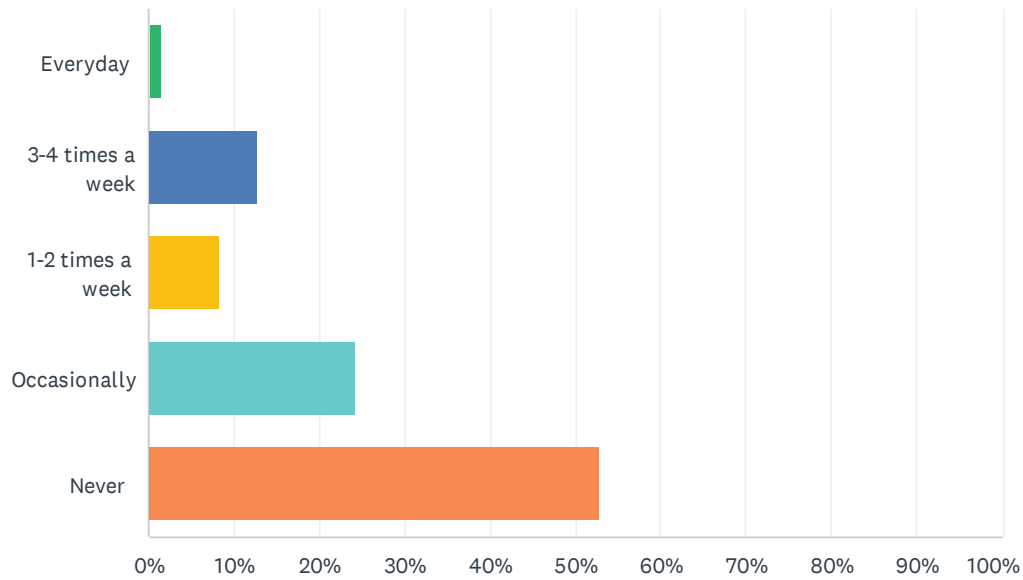

Q5 How often do you play tennis a week?

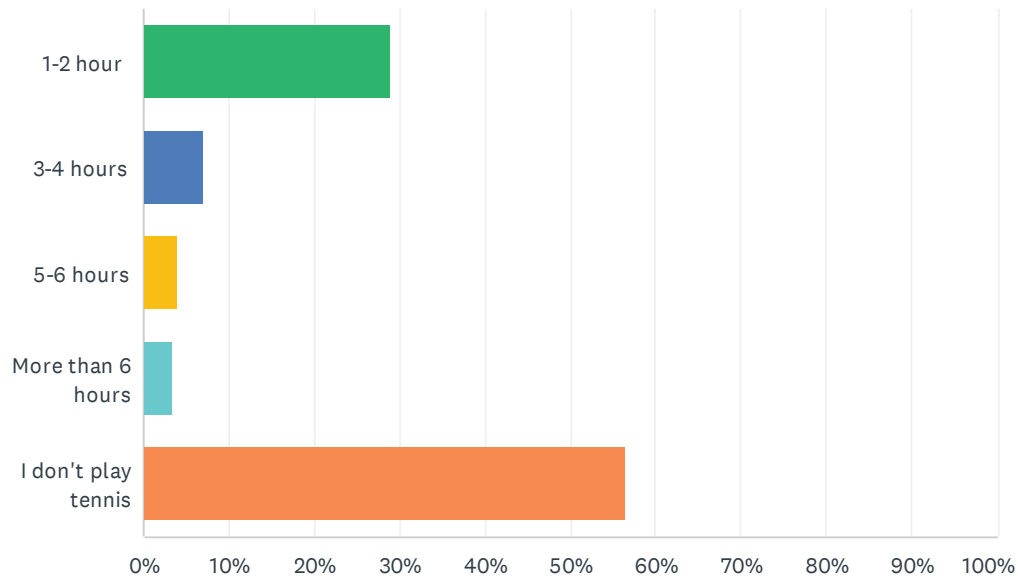

Q6 On average, how many hours do you play tennis a week?

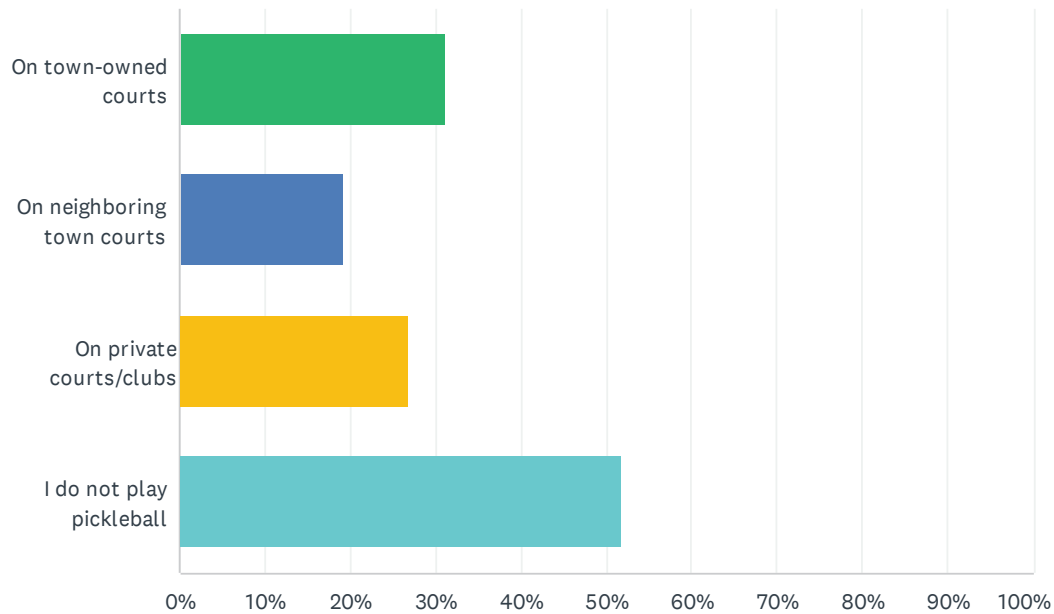

Q7 Where do you play pickleball? (select all that apply)

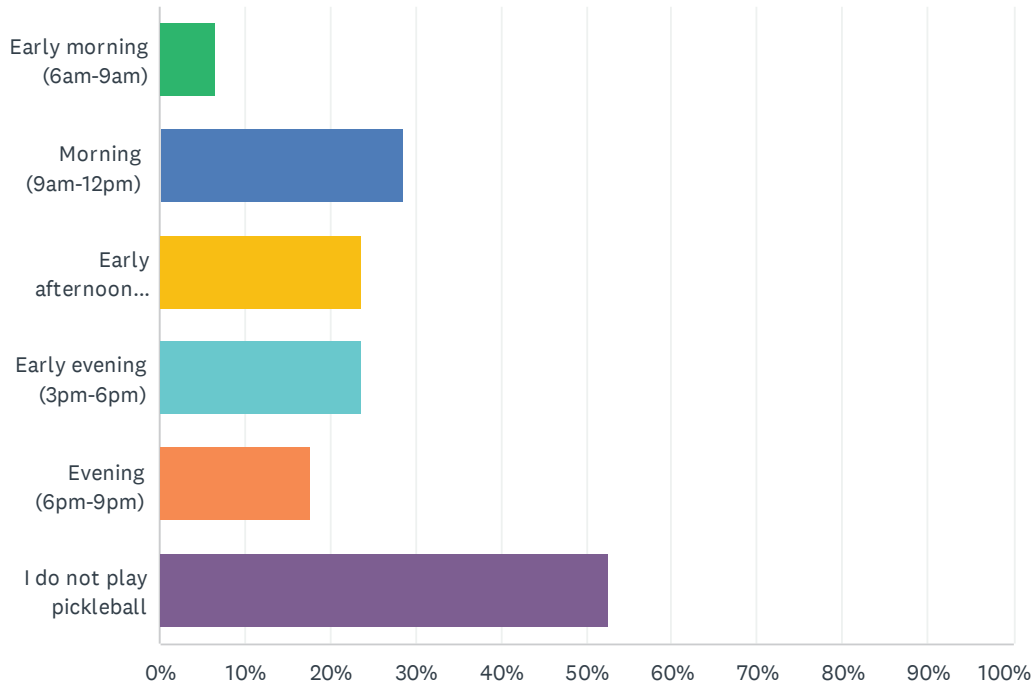

Q8 What times during the day do you play pickleball? (Select all that apply)

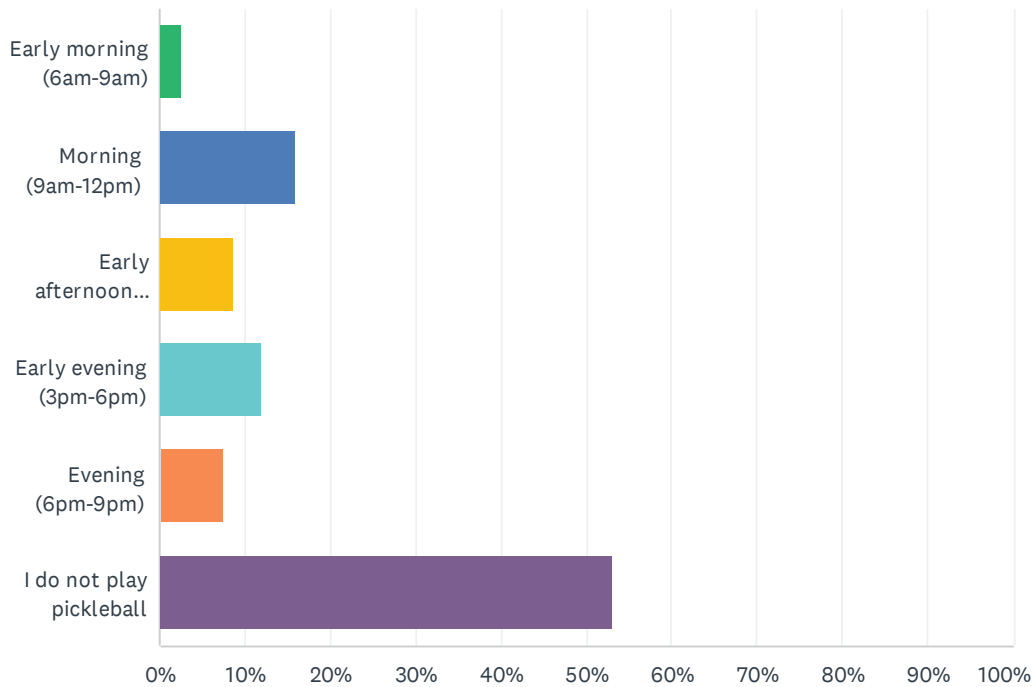

Q9 What times during the day do you most often play pickleball?

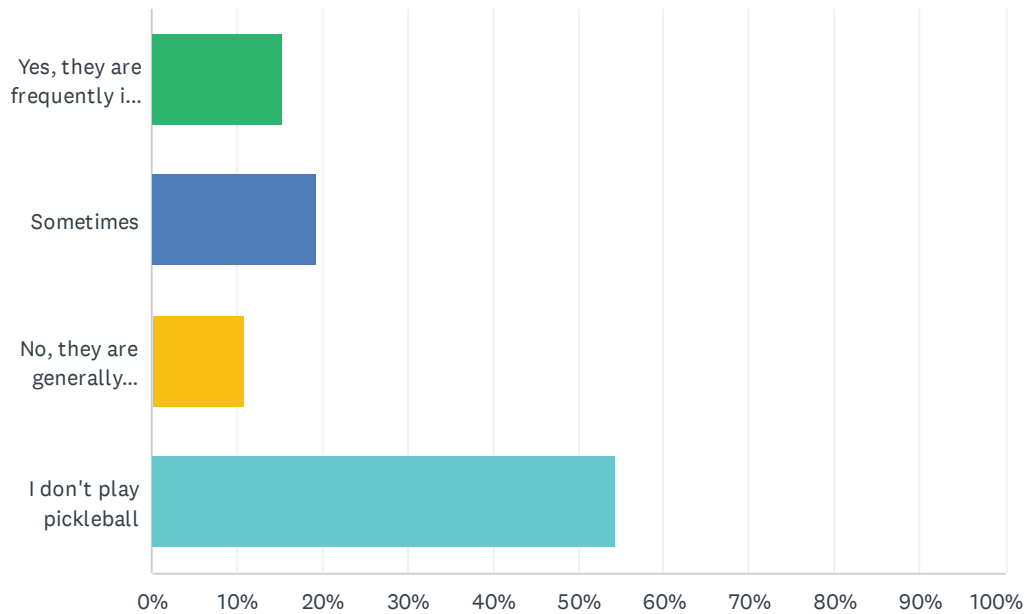

Q10 Do you have any trouble finding an open pickleball court in town?

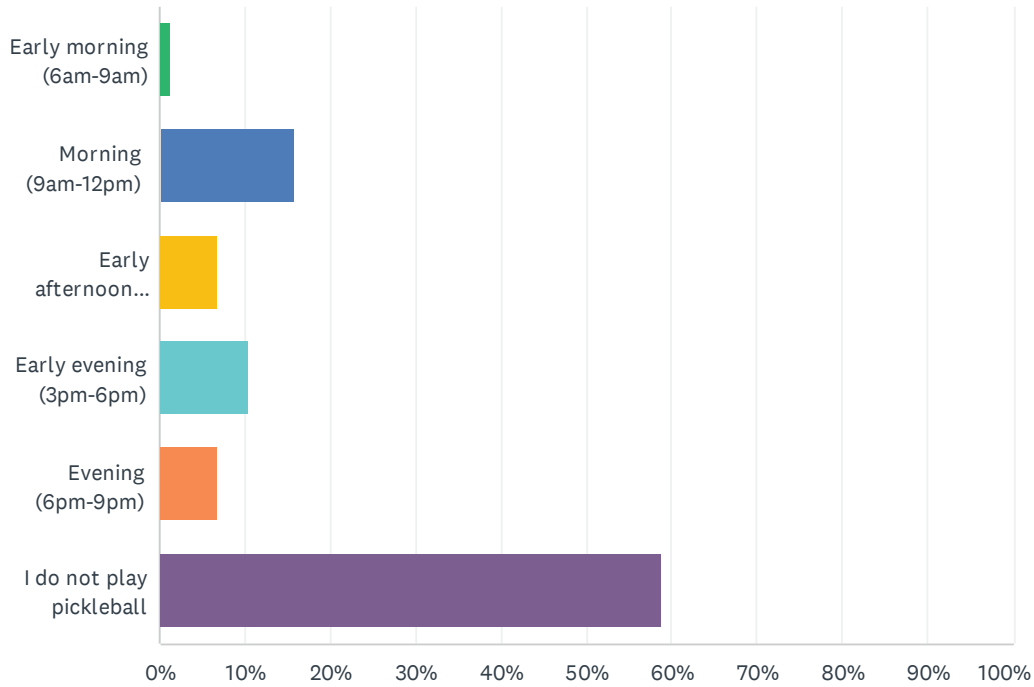

Q11 If you have trouble finding an open pickleball court in town, what time of the day do you have the most trouble?

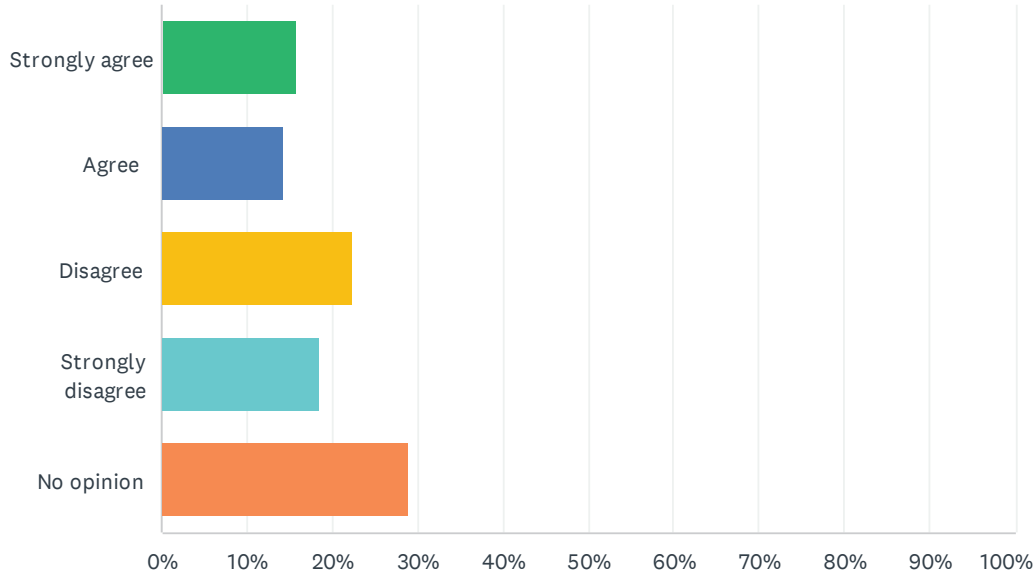

Q12 How strongly to you agree with the statement, "there is an adequate number of pickleball courts in Wellesley"?

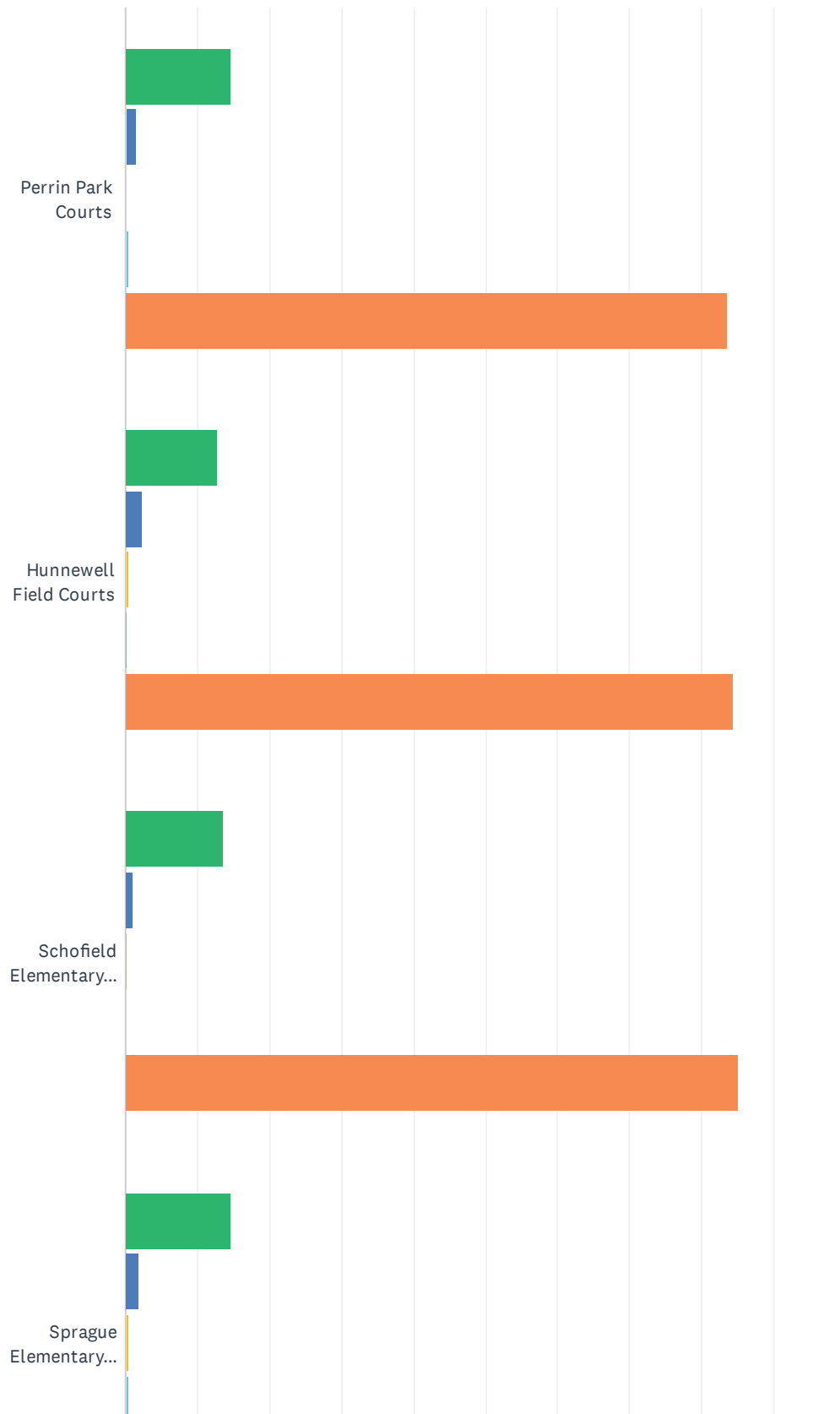

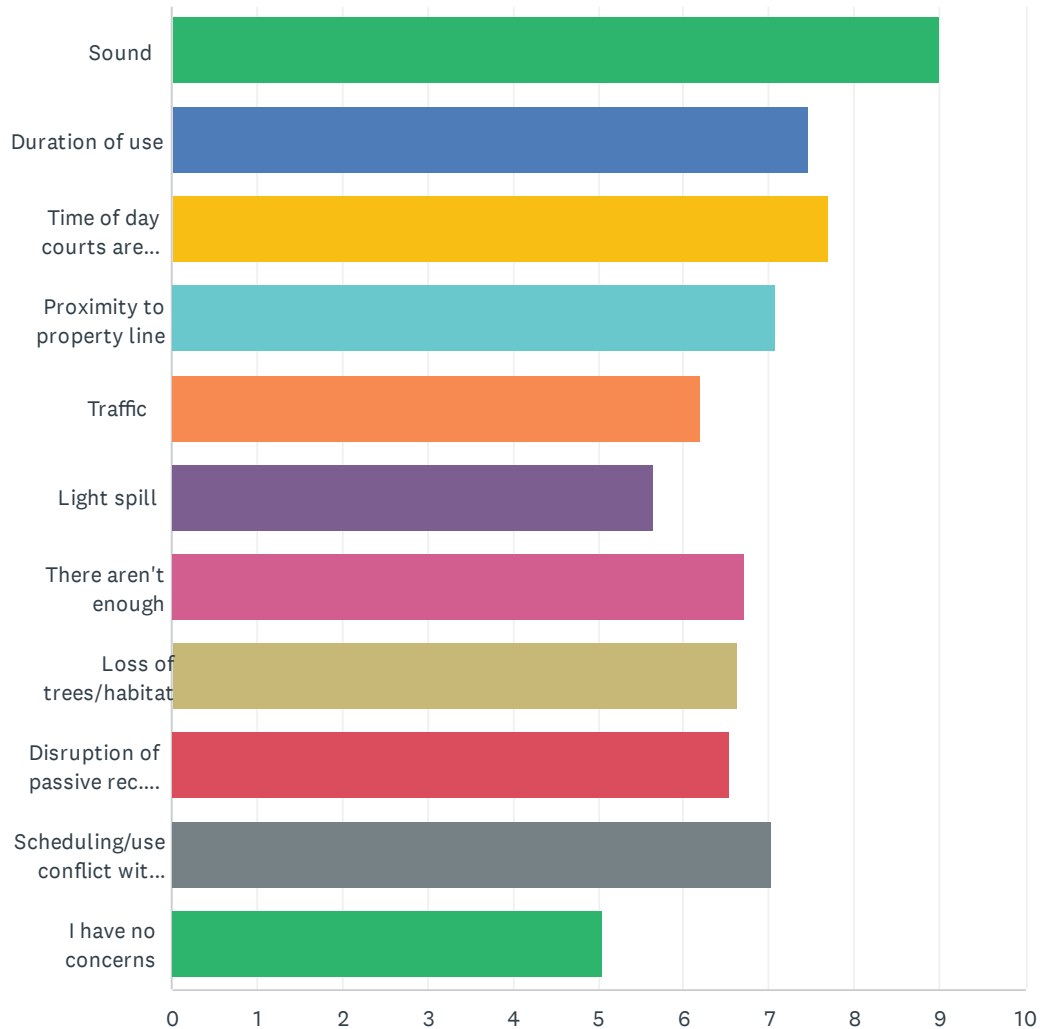

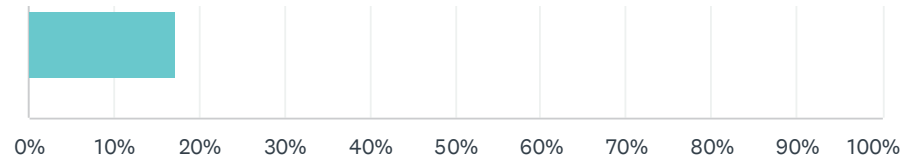

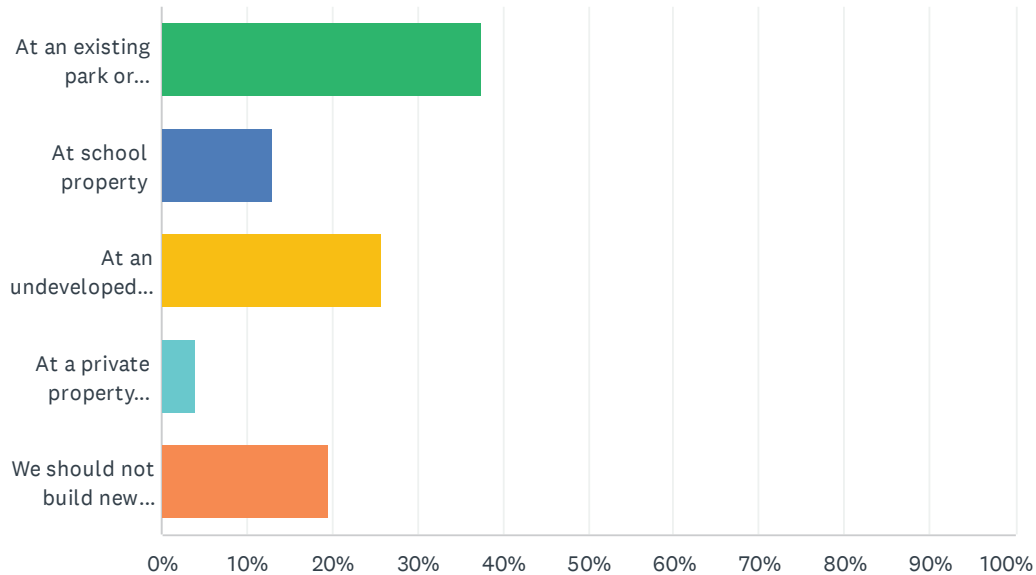

Q16 Where do you feel the best location for a new pickleball court would be?

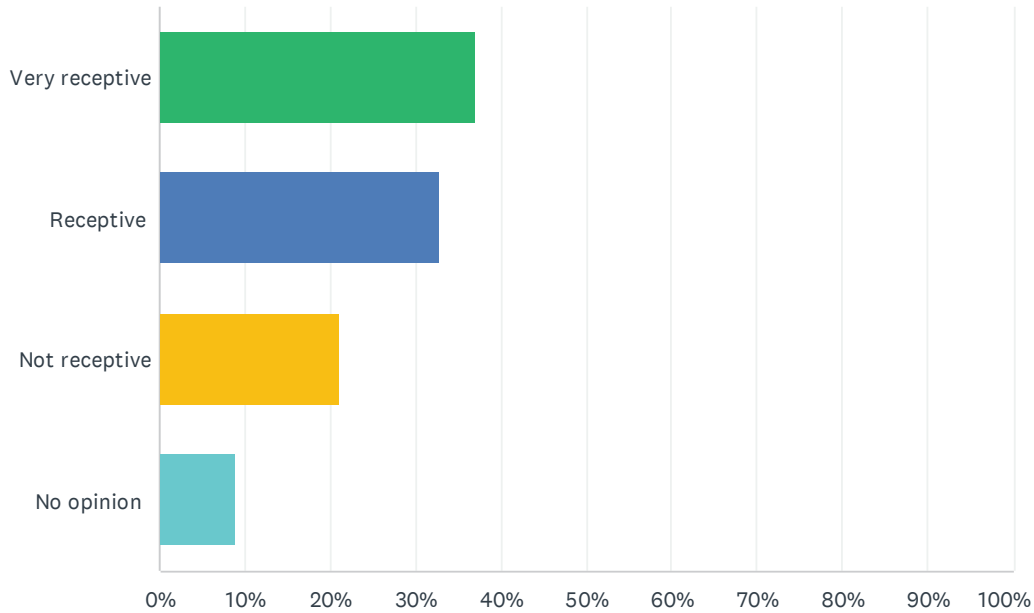

Q17 If necessary, how receptive would you be to the construction of an enclosed/indoor pickleball court in Wellesley?

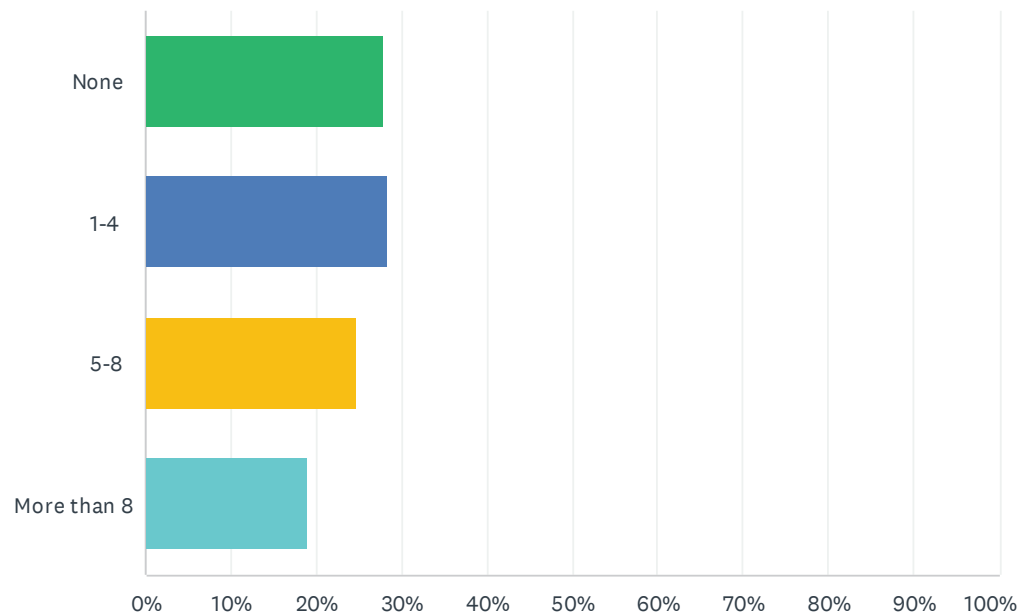

Q18 How many additional pickleball courts do you think Wellesley should have?

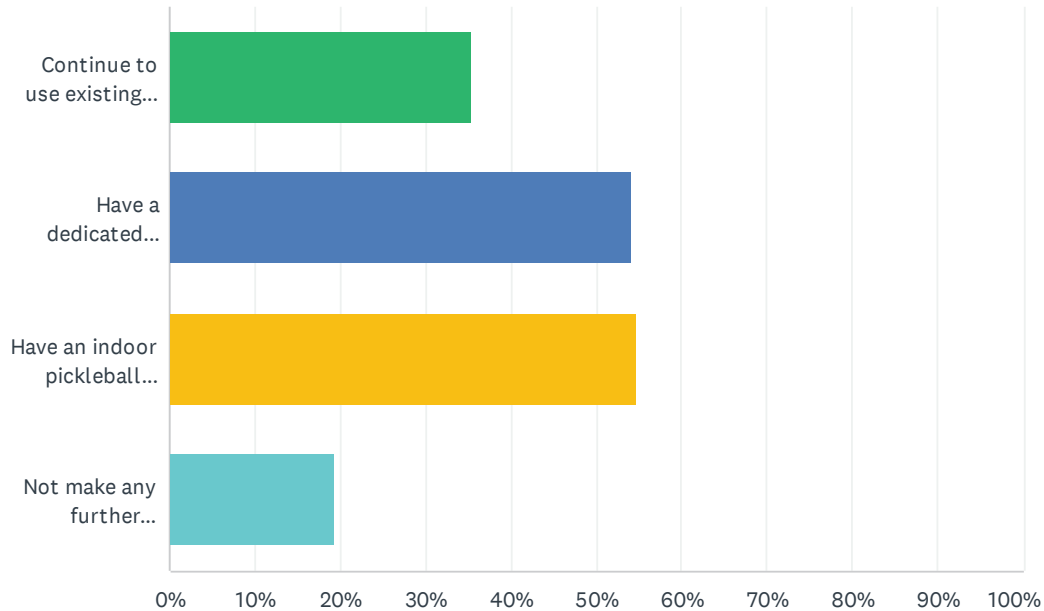

Q19 As Wellesley continues to try to allocate court space for pickleball, do you think we should (select all that apply):

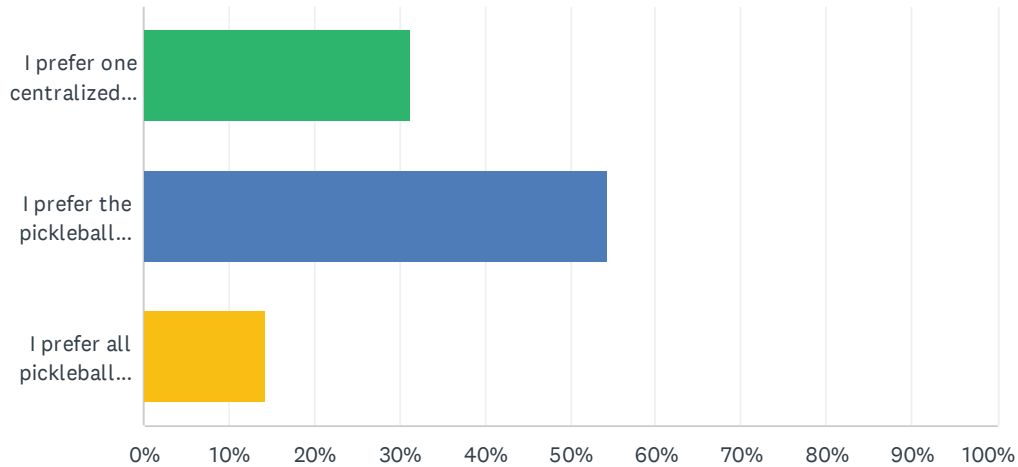

Q20 What is your preference related to the location of pickleball courts in town?

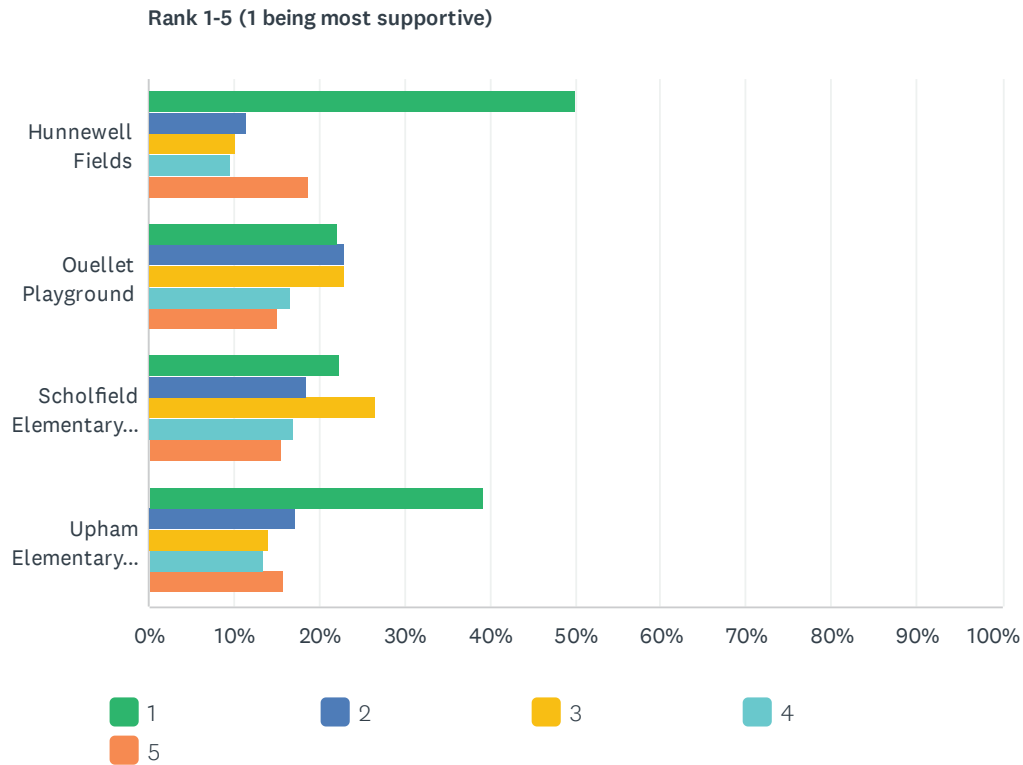

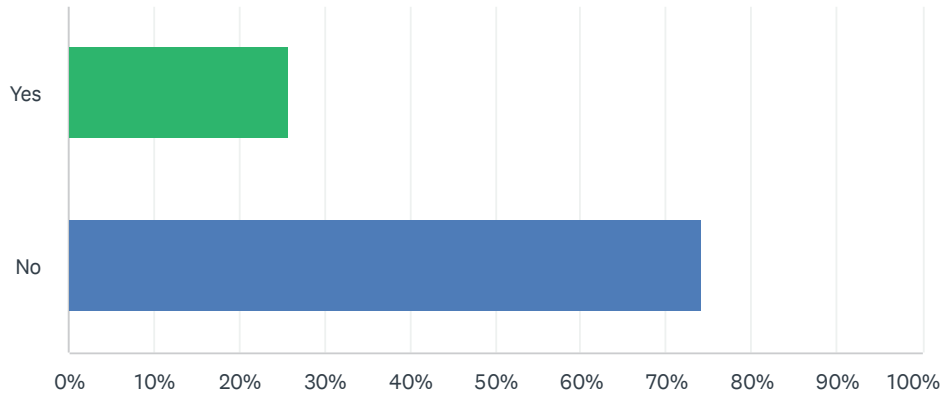

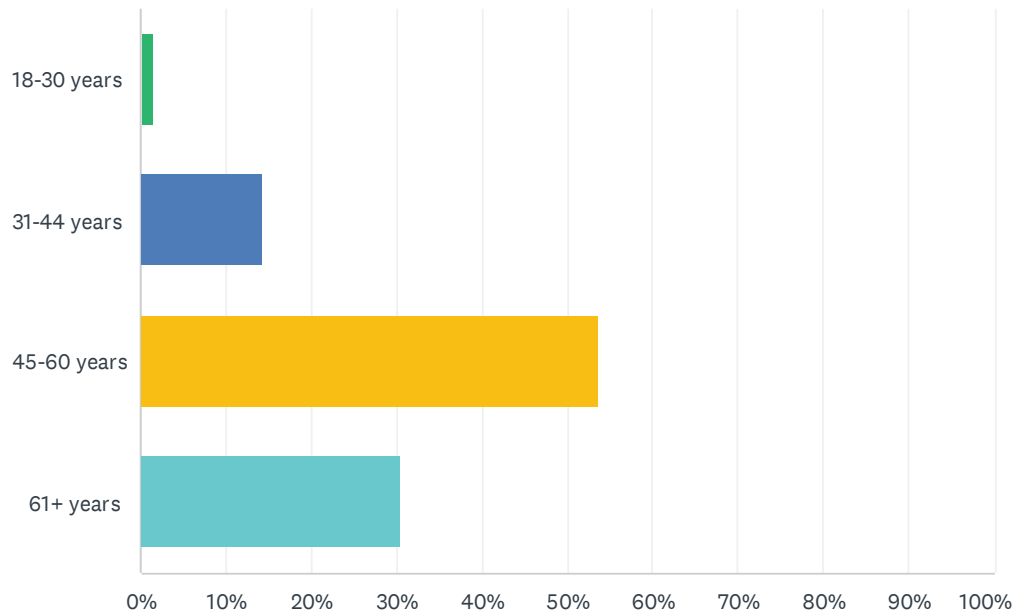

As was suggested at the last meeting, the consultants should also look at the regional needs and availability of courts and determine whether Wellesley should partner with surrounding towns to explore appropriate pickleball sites. As we know, more commercial sites are opening and some towns are also creating courts. The Morses Pond parking lot and abutting woods should not be selected for consideration as a potential pickleball site because it would (i) significantly disturb the abutting passive uses such as hiking, birdwatching, and fishing; (ii) disturb the abutting natural habitat; and (iii) significantly reduce the parking capacity necessary to support parking for those visiting the Pond beach and trails, currently estimated at 24,000 annually. Given the time and money already expended to design the beautiful renovation of the MOPO beach area, it seems fiscally irresponsible to spend town money to explore the MOPO parking lot as a potential site given that it will result in the loss of beach/trail-walking parking. The siting of 4-6 pickleball courts, plus parking for up to 48 cars for pickleballers (6 courts x 4 players each = 24, plus another 24 parked and waiting for the next game) conflicts with the Consultants' estimate for increased parking needs after the MOPO renovation. Due to the ongoing negative impact of the sound on those who live near Sprague and Perrin, I believe those courts should be immediately closed, regardless of whether or not other sites are determined to be feasible for new courts. You will note that I am a pickleball player, although brand new to the sport this winter. I was not able to answer the questions about frequency, sites, or time of day since I have not yet experienced a spring/summer/fall season of playing. My only playing time thus far was in the Warren Building. I imagine I would play 1-3x/week and my playing time would likely be between 9 a.m - 5 p.m. (I'm flexible). As much as I would love to play on courts in our town for free, my personal desires do not trump what is good for others and the environment and I will go elsewhere if necessary. Finally, it is VERY important to note this PROBLEM with the survey: On question 14, which asks us to rank our concerns, I ranked 1-9 and then put NA for two. Once I entered the NA, the survey then COMPLETELY changed my rankings and eliminated what I had put as #1 & #2. Had I not gone back to review, the response that was submitted would have NOT represented what my true response was. I do not think you will be able to use the responses for this question (which is actually one of the most essential questions) for anyone who used an NA because it may not represent their true opinion. Also, it was difficult to answer some questions such as, "how many courts do we need?" I'm not sure how anyone can answer that without knowing what the actual need is? Thank you for revising the survey and for asking for community input.
