Additional Information:

- *Wellesley Townsman*, Friday August 25, 1911: “At a meeting of the Selectmen on Tuesday evening...A permit was granted to Stuart P. (sic) Molony to move the Fuller house on Washington Street, near the Old High School, to a lot on Washington Street nearly opposite Oakland Street.”
- *Wellesley Townsman*, Friday September 8, 1911: “The work of moving the old Fuller house through Washington Street at the Hills was carried on during several days this week. The crossing of the Boston and Worcester tracks was done Wednesday night after midnight to prevent interference with traffic.”
