Butterfly Garden for Sun

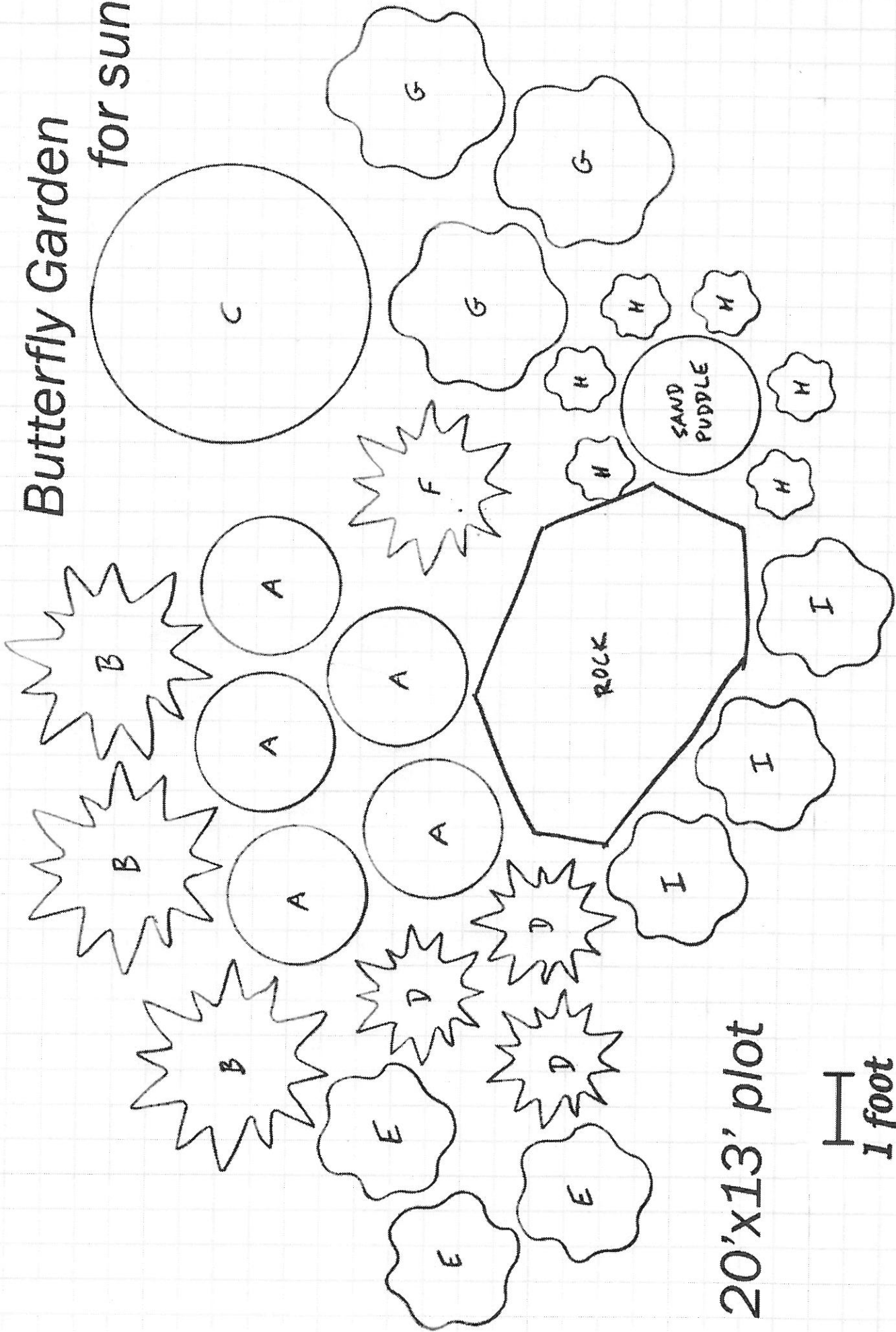
- A. *Asclepias tuberosa* or *Asclepias incarnata* (5)
- B. *Aster novae-angliae* or *novae-belgii* (3)
- C. *Buddleia davidii* 'Black Knight' or 'Adonis Blue' (1)
- D. *Liatris spicata* Kobold (any cultivar) (3)
- E. *Solidago* 'Little Lemon' or *Coreopsis*, any cultivar (3)
- F. *Malva alcea* 'Fastigiata' or *Phlox paniculata*, any cultivar (1)
- G. *Eupatorium rugosum* 'Chocolate' or *Eupatorium coelestinum* (3)
- H. *Trifolium repens* (6)
- I. *Potentilla atrosanguinea*, *Geum coccineum* or *Gaillardia grandiflora* (3)

Watching butterflies in a garden is one of the pleasures of summer. This garden combines host plants where butterflies lay their eggs with plants that supply nectar for food and is a good start towards attracting butterflies to your garden. Add a small water area, partially filled with sand, and a rock or log on which the butterflies rest to complete this welcoming habitat.
